The new position, Manager of Health Equity and Strategic Priorities, will work with the Equity, Inclusion and Anti-Racism Steering Committee to support the development and delivery of integrated and seamless care that is rooted in anti-racism and equitable approaches to population health. The Manager will also support the implementation of the GHHN Equity, Inclusion, and Anti-Racism Framework and Action Plan as well as provide support to additional strategic initiatives as they emerge.

The posting closed on July 9th with an anticipated start date in August 2021.



Building healthcare together through engagement! GHHN Engagement

The Greater Hamilton Health Network is working alongside people with lived and living experience (patients, families and caregivers) as partners to co-design the GHHN engagement strategy. The engagement strategy will set out overarching principles that will guide and embed these essential partners in the work of the GHHN. This strategy will serve as an ongoing demonstration of the GHHN's commitment to engagement and building a health care system that is connected, strengthened and patient centred.

The team has developed a draft outline of the models of engagement, provided input into governance development, is working to develop terminology that is reflective of our communities, and is in the process of developing an outline of the various roles and experience needed to support the engagement models.

Engagement is foundational to the work of the GHHN, simply put, we believe that services and systems co-designed with people with lived experience are better for everyone involved,

Going Green McMaster Sustainability students partner on GHHN priorities

The GHHN has provided two McMaster Student groups from the Sustain 2SS3, Advocating for Sustainability class, with the opportunity to work on two unique projects (over the summer) that will support GHHN priorities. The first is a student group focusing on Health Equity, looking at local and global research to develop recommendations that will have the greatest impact on local health outcomes, share lessons learned, and develop visual products to communicate important information. The second group is working with Dr. Brian McKenna, Marijka (Hamilton Family Health Team), and Melissa (GHHN) on a Long Term Care Home, Green Initiatives project. This group will develop recommendations of how to implement a plant-rich diet in long-term care homes and investigate how plant-rich diets can help with chronic diseases. We look forward to their report and social media campaign!

A special thank you to Dr. Meghan Davis, Marijke Jurriaans and the Green Team for offering their support, expertise and permission to use their research for this project; and to Dr. Brian McKenna for leading the Long Term Care Home green initiative project with the students!

A Virtual Urgent Care program sustainment proposal was submitted to Ontario Health for continued funding through FY 2021-22. This program is currently operational and supported by Hamilton Health Sciences, St. Joseph's Healthcare Hamilton, and London Health Sciences.

The Ontario Health West Secure Communications Working Group continues to explore the current state of secure communication systems across the region.

IDS continues to work with:


- The GHHN team on evaluating OHT data for the priority populations,

Women's Health Drop-In Days August 25th and 26th

The Greater Hamilton Health Network partners are working to build a more connected health care system for all local females who are experiencing homelessness.

Local partners are coming together August 25 and 26 from 12 pm-4pm (both days) at Willow's Place to provide Women's Health Drop-in Days. These Drop-in Days will provide local women with access to free health care services, peer support, entertainment, wellness activities and more. Doctors, nurse practitioners, nurses, and other health care providers will be on site to offer free clinical services including exams, testing, contraceptives, and vaccines. Other supports and community booths will include wellness and art activities, giveaways, and prizes. We know that health equity leads to better health outcomes, and that it takes a community response to build hope, health and belonging. These days will offer an opportunity for the Greater Hamilton Health Network partners to introduce themselves to local females and begin the journey to co-design supports and services alongside them.
