

Dr. Kerry Beal and her colleagues at Shelter Health Network have been working nonstop since the onset of the COVID 19 pandemic. When the pandemic was declared, very little was known about how the virus was spread or the consequences; their team stepped up in a major way.

Armed with little personal protective equipment (and, frankly, having to recycle it due to supply issues) and some swabs, they went into the shelters to try and trace those infected and keep them isolated to keep everyone safe. They managed many outbreaks in the shelter system, looking after this marginalized population with dignity and grace...and a whole lot of worry.

They have been there since the beginning of the pandemic, toiling away to help keep the most vulnerable safe. When vaccines came out, they took to the streets with swabs and now syringes and needles, offering vaccines to all. They managed to immunize vast numbers of people; keeping track of those immunized being a difficult challenge as many don't have government issued identification. Through sheer will and the ability to adapt quickly, they managed.





Now Kerry has been reaching out to the boat in port to make sure that they are properly swabbed and immunized.

Among us walk many heroes. This pandemic has highlighted just where the gaps are in our system and shown those who are willing to help fill them. Dr. Kerry Beal and her team are those heroes. Thank you for all you have done to keep our citizens alive and safe.
